A former US Navy lieutenant, Bromberg has championed veterans' causes as the executive sponsor of UTC-4-Vets, an employee-resource group for veterans at Pratt & Whitney and United Technologies, and through his service on the board of the USO of Metropolitan New York.

Gretchen Carlson



Gretchen Carlson is among the nation's most recognized news anchors and a vocal advocate for equality and empowerment of women. A longtime fixture on Fox News, she was co-host on the number-one rated cable morning news show, *Fox and Friends*, for seven years before becoming host of her own current affairs program, *The Real Story with Gretchen Carlson*. Her 2015 bestselling memoir, *Getting Real*, recounts the arc of her career from local news reporter to

national television personality and the lessons learned along the way. In 2016, Carlson became the public face of sexual harassment in the workplace after blowing the whistle on the misogynist culture at the Fox News network. In the aftermath of her lawsuit, she has taken up the fight for safe working conditions for women, starting with the creation of the Gift of Courage Fund to support organizations working with women and girls, including survivors of sexual harassment, assault, and abuse.

Brooke Cartus



LGBTQ activist Brooke Cartus is a senior facilitator with ImprovEdge, a corporate training and consulting company that helps clients learn to think on their feet, improve collaboration, and cultivate a positive work environment. The multi-talented Cartus is also a marketing professional at a national insurance company, a licensed attorney, a classically trained musician, and a stand-up comedian. She has facilitated public discussions on diversity and inclusion with a

wide range of organizations, and works extensively on behalf of trans and gender non-binary populations in central Ohio. Cartus is on the board at Equality Ohio and volunteers at the Legal Aid Society of Columbus. She also volunteers her time hosting fundraisers for organizations that include the Ohio Art League, Human Rights Campaign, Kaleidoscope, the Mid-Ohio Food Bank, and Stonewall Columbus. Her work has appeared in the *Berkeley Journal of Gender, Law & Justice, The HuffPost,* and *614 Magazine.*

Joe Cozzolino



As senior vice president of Cisco Services, Joe Cozzolino leads the company's growing \$12 billion global services business. Before her appointment at Simmons, Drinan had a highly successful career in the private and nonprofit sectors, with stints as senior vice president of human resources at Caritas Christi Health Care, president and CEO of the Society of Human Resources Management, and executive vice president of human resources for BankBoston. She is currently an appointed member of the President's Trust of the Association of American Colleges and Universities, has served on the Commonwealth's Court Management Advisory Board, and is a former vice chair of the board of directors of Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts.

Raquel Eatmon



Entrepreneur, author, and possibility broker, Raquel Eatmon is CEO of the communications company Rising Media LLC and founder of the Woman of Power Leadership Conference in Cleveland, Ohio. Starting out with a promising career in television, she quickly climbed the ranks as an anchor/reporter in top markets. But over time she grew disillusioned with the broadcast news business and left her high-profile position in search of deeper purpose. That purpose

became women's empowerment. Eatmon documented her own struggle to overcome rejection and give meaning to her work in *Strut Your Stuff: Principles in Purpose, Power, and Position,* a resource guide for women seeking to change their lives. She continues to deliver her motivational messages in a national newspaper column, *Be Inspired with Raquel,* and is a regular contributor to *HuffPost.* Eatmon currently serves on the advisory board of the Ursuline College Center of Excellence in Leadership.

Nely Galán



Latina media dynamo Nely Galán, dubbed the "Tropical Tycoon" by *The New York Times Magazine*, is one of the entertainment industry's savviest talents. As the former President of Entertainment for Telemundo, she was the first Latina to head up a major US television network. She has owned and operated her own media company since 1994, creating content across all platforms for the women's and Latino markets. Galán is also founder and president of

Santa Clara LLC, a real estate development and investment company with commercial and residential holdings in multiple states. With all of this success, she has made it her mission to teach other Latina women how they, too, can become entrepreneurs, starting with the publication of her bestseller, *Self-Made: Becoming Empowered, Self-Reliant, and Rich in Every Way.* To further support women's entrepreneurship, Galán also founded The Adelante Movement (Move Forward!), a nonprofit that provides training and resources for aspiring business owners.

A faculty affiliate of Simmons College, Anna Giraldo-Kerr is an executive coach and facilitator who partners with professionals who want to develop the skills and competencies required to be 21st-century leaders and mentors. A former Institutional Investor-ranked equity research analyst, she also served as president and co-founder of Rose Park Advisors, specializing in investment in companies whose business models are well-suited to take advantage of industry change. Johnson is the author of

Dream, Dare, Do as well as Disrupt Yourself: Putting the Power of Disruptive Innovation to Work—one of Inc. Magazine's Top 100 Business Books in 2015. Michelle Robinson Obama



Michelle Robinson Obama served as First Lady of the United States from 2009 to 2017.

As a transformative First Lady, Mrs. Obama launched and led four key initiatives: Let's Move!, to address the challenge of childhood obesity; Joining Forces, to support veterans, service members and their families; Reach Higher, to inspire young people to seek higher education; and Let Girls Learn, to help adolescent girls around the

world go to school.

Before becoming First Lady, Michelle Obama attended Princeton University and Harvard Law School. She started her career as an attorney at the Chicago law firm, Sidley & Austin, where she met her future husband, Barack Obama. She later worked in the Chicago mayor's office, the University of Chicago, and the University of Chicago Medical Center. Mrs. Obama also founded the Chicago chapter of Public Allies, an organization that prepares young people for careers in public service.

Mrs. Obama was born on January 17, 1964. She married Barack Obama in 1992. They currently live in Washington, DC and have two daughters, Malia and Sasha.

Alison Overholt



As vice president and editor-in-chief of *ESPN The Magazine* and espnW, Alison Overholt is the first woman to hold the top editorial position at a national, general-interest sports magazine. She was part of ESPN's early efforts to research and develop a sports media offering for women and was espnW's founding editor. Under her guidance, *ESPN The Magazine* received the prestigious National Magazine Award for General Excellence in the news, sports, and entertainment

category presented by the American Society of Magazine Editors. For the past two years running, Overholt was named one of *AdWeek*'s Most Powerful Women in Sports and one of *Folio*'s Top Women in Media. The NYC Metro Chapter of WISE (Women in Sports and Events) also honored her as a Woman of Inspiration in 2016. Overholt currently teaches applied research methods to students in the sports management, hospitality, and tourism departments of New York University.

Valerie Plame



As a career covert operations officer, Valerie Plame worked for years to protect national security and prevent proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. But in July 2003, she was "outed" as a CIA operative. The ensuing political firestorm fueled an investigation uncovering suspicions that the Bush Administration purposefully compromised her identity. Plame describes the intimate details of this shocking event in her bestselling autobiography, *Fair Game: My Life as a Spy*,

My Betrayal by the White House, which was later adapted into a major motion picture. She continues her service in global intelligence as an advisory board member of the cyber security company Global Data Sentinel. She also serves on the boards of several nonprofits, including Global Zero, the Penn State School of International Affairs, the United Way of Santa Fe County, and Postpartum Support International. In addition to writing and speaking about NSA operations, nuclear disarmament, and other security issues, Plame has co-authored two espionage thrillers, *Blowback* and *Burned*.

Monica Latowicki Rabin



Monica Latowicki Rabin is a vice president and general manager at 2U, Inc., which partners with colleges and universities to deliver their degree programs online. As a longtime "2Ute," she has taken on a variety of leadership roles for a range of organizations and is currently responsible for managing the six online master's programs at Simmons College.
